



Researching Good Practice

1. **Learning from** Study tours for the TEN Group to Dutch cities, Lille and Roubaix, Berlin and Potsdam and Belfast have been written up in illustrated reports that show what British planners could learn from European experience of major regeneration schemes.

2. **Beyond Eco-towns** The report produced with PRP and Design for Homes is based on six case studies in four countries and shows how local authorities play a leading role in developing major eco-friendly schemes. URBED produced supplementary reports on *Making Eco-towns Work: Developing Vathorst* and *The Economic Issues*.

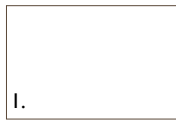
3. **Partners in Urban Renaissance** Used to launch the first Urban Summit, URBED worked with 24 towns and cities and the ODPM to set out what had been achieved, case studies of good practice, and how the barriers could be overcome.

4. **Better Neighbourhoods: making higher densities work** This short report synthesised the results of a number of research projects and case studies of exemplary projects, and proposed the use of charters to improve the planning process.

5. **Managing mixed communities** Based on case studies of leading edge projects, this guide and accompanying literature review provides advice on management options.

6. **Tomorrow's Suburbs** Designed as a web based toolkit, this guide contains over 60 proven tools for better planning organised under seven themes and cross-referenced.

7. **Regeneration in European Cities** This report for JRF draws on case studies of Rotterdam, Gothenburg, and Lille/Roubaix, which were partnered with similar places in the UK.
